






5th Semester B.Voc Students Completes Retail Internship in Dimapur and Kohima

On 11th November 2024, the Department of Education, Modern College, celebrated National Education Day. Ms. Vini Achumi, Assistant Professor from the Dept of B.Voc, gave a brief account of why we celebrate it.

She mentioned that the NEP 2020 was prepared under the chairmanship of Dr. K Kasturirangan. The committee was constituted in 2017 and was approved by the Union Cabinet on 29 July 2020. The main purpose of NEP 2020 was to design a vision and framework for both school education and Higher education in India.

She mentioned that the old education structure of 10+2 is now modified to 5+3+3+4 as per the new policy covering the age group of 3 to 18. The UG degree is available for 3 and 4 years duration and has multiple entry and exit options within this period.

She also gave a briefing about ABC known as Academic Bank of Credit, an online academic bank to store students' credit. Overall the session was a successful one.

A researcher always looks for possible problems to solve, problems that make him/her ask the question "why?". The "why" is a gap that calls for future investigation. Dr. Kholia explained about what Literature Review, Review Research Paper are and showed the basic skeleton of a Review Research Paper. Review Research Paper is important because it helps identify problems the existing research paper has not been able to tackle and hence detect a gap for future research.

The programme's moderator was Ms. Pulovili Lohe, HoD, Dept. of Education. Welcome note was delivered by Dr. Vitsou Yano, Principal, Modern College and the programme concluded with a Vote of Thanks by Ms. Vini Achumi, IQAC Co-ordinator. All the teaching faculty attended the programme and it was a fruitful session for all the attendees.
