

Report on NIT to Ahmedabad, Gujarat

A total of 18 students and 2 teaching faculty from Modern College, Piphema, were privileged to undertake the National Integration Tour (NIT) to Ahmedabad, Gujarat which was sponsored by 7 Assam Rifles under Assam Rifles Project 2023-24. The journey started with a flagging off ceremony at 7 Assam Rifles HQ. We left Dimapur Railway Station on 29th September at 12:17 am and we arrived at New Delhi railway station by the afternoon of 30th September. We visited the Red Fort or Lal Qila located at Old Delhi, India Gate and National War Memorial which stands as a memorial to 84,000 soldiers of the Indian Army who sacrificed their lives during the WWI during our short stop at Delhi after which we left for Ahmedabad at 7:55 in the evening.


After reaching Ahmedabad at around 8:15 in the morning of 1st October, we visited the auto world museum which is one of the biggest personal collections of vintage cars, bikes, buggies and utility vehicles. We also visited Akshardham Temple at Gandhinagar where we also enjoyed a light and water show. The second day started with a long ride to visit the statue of unity which is the tallest statue in the world and located at Kevadia colony. On 3rd October we were honored to meet the GOC and all officers of the Golden Katar Division and got to experience a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity of riding a tank as well. After that we headed to visit the Sabarmati Ashram which is also famously known as Gandhi Ashram and ended the day with a visit to Atal bridge.

The next day we were all excited to visit the prestigious IIM (INDIAN INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT) Ahmedabad which has produced personalities like Mallika Sarabhai, Raghuram Rajan and Chetan Bhagat. After the visit we proceeded to ISRO Ahmedabad which is also known as Vikram Sarabhai Space Exhibition where we got to learn about the miracles of outer space.



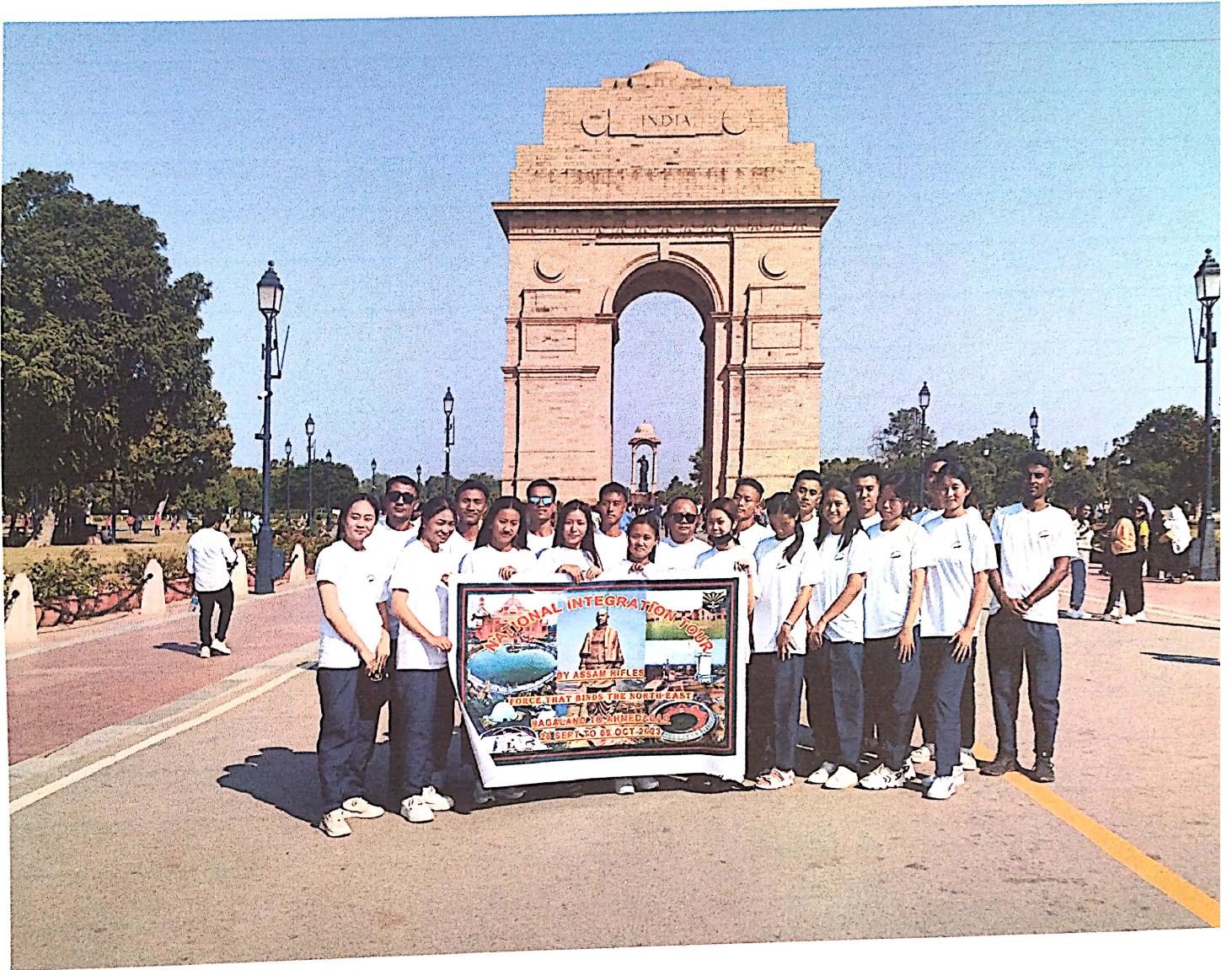

The department of Economics and 6th Semester General went to Kaziranga as part of an exposure tour on 13th and 14th April 2024.

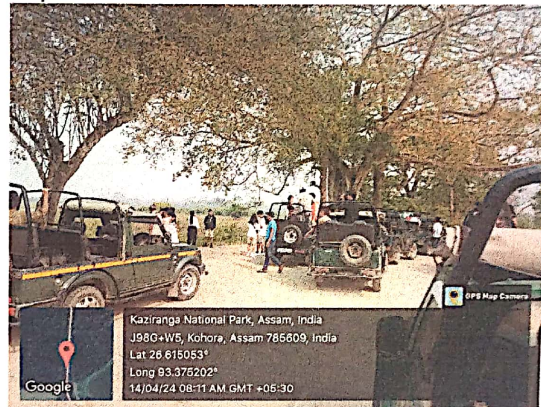


Modern College Organises Departmental Exposure Tour for Students
