beliefs. He emphasized that literature is not just a source of education but a powerful tool for safeguarding heritage.



REPORT ON MINI MARATHON 2025

Modern College organised 10K Mini Marathon as part of Modern Week 2025, under the theme 'Run for Good Health' On February 11, 2025 promoting health, fitness, and community engagement. The marathon, which took place from 7:00 AM to 9:00 AM, featured two race categories: 10KM for men and 6KM for women. A total of 76 participants took part in the Mini Marathon Race.

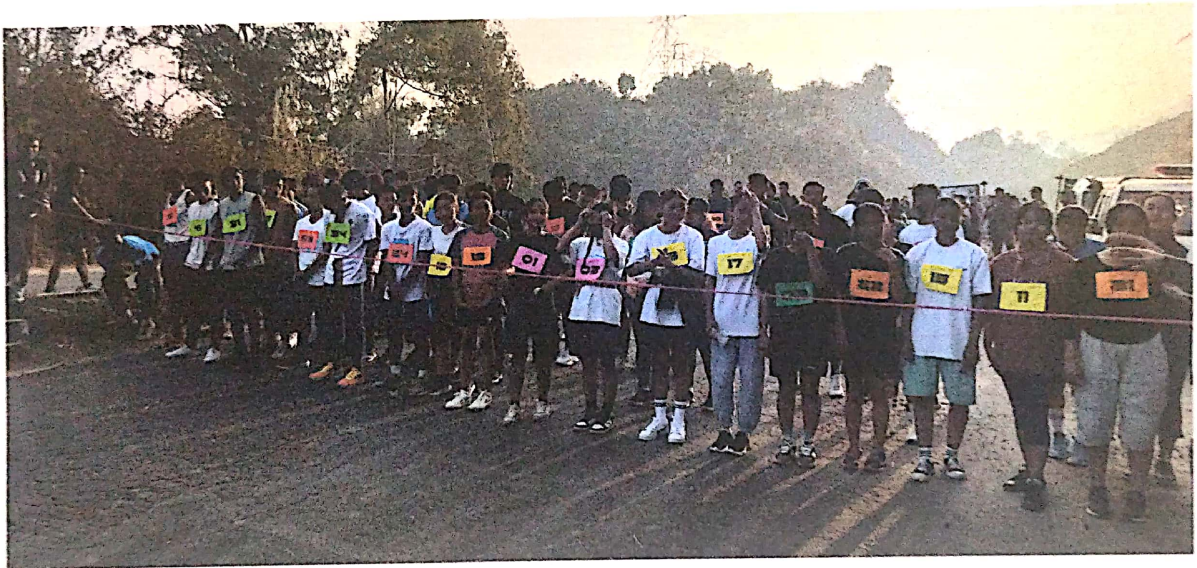
